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Principal's Message Success at School

As February arrives, we look forward to the second half of our school year. This is a great time to revisit routines and healthy habits. As I review our students' progress at Fairview, I always notice some things that demonstrate a lot about success. I think this month is a great time to share these thoughts with you:

- 1. The first is **Attendance**. We know that illness impacts attendance for health and safety reasons. It is a good time to review the importance of regular attendance at school. Most students who do very well at school academically, socially, physically, and emotionally will have great attendance. They are here almost every day, and they are here on time. Both of these things are extremely important for learning. A lot is learned every moment we are at school; everything from friendships to Science experiments to problem-solving to writing, reading, and Math concepts attendance makes a huge difference in your child's progress in both learning and self-confidence.
- 2. The second is **Consistent Sleep Patterns**. Students who participate well in a classroom with confidence are actively engaged. I see this when I visit classrooms daily. Sleep affects participation every day. When a child sleeps 7-9 hours each night, their brain grows, making connections, repairing, and re-calibrating. A good sleep routine affects participation and learning well every day.

As we enter February, we have great days ahead in learning. Check out our calendar dates inside the newsletter for upcoming dates and events. Soon, report cards will be created for our third term of learning. Thank you in advance for ensuring that your young child has regular attendance, a good sleep, and is ready to actively participate at school, recognizing that we are all responsible for demonstrating respect for ourselves, others, learning, and property. someone with more power - it can be verbal, physical, social, and or online. Pink Shirt Day also highlights where to turn for help - the provincial bullying helpline is 1-888-456-2323 to get help anonymously in more than 170 languages.
